#### Purpose of BAA Courses

#### Policy Statement

Board/Authority Authorized Courses (BAA courses) are offered by schools to respond to the <u>local needs</u> of the schools and their communities while providing choice and flexibility for students. BAA courses are <u>authorized by Boards/Authorities</u> according to requirements set by the Ministry of Education

#### Purpose of BAA Courses



#### <u>Authority</u>

The School Act, Sections 85 (2) (i) and 168 (2) (b): 85 (2) ... A board may, subject to this Act and the regulations, do all or any of the following...

(i) develop and offer local programs for use in schools in the school district

168 (2) The minister may make orders for the purpose of carrying out any of the minister's powers, duties or functions under this Act and, without restriction, may make orders...

(b)  $\ldots$  determining the general requirements for graduation from an educational program

#### **Guiding Principles**



- courses <u>are</u> guided by specific Ministry of Education requirements
- courses are elective credits (Grades 10-12) that count towards graduation in the 2004 or the 2018 Graduation Program
- courses cannot be used toward the Adult Graduation Program
- courses do not have pre-requisites



### Important Changes for 2018/19



- Boards of Education are to review their Board/Authority Authorized (BAA) courses to determine which will be delivered as new Ministry courses.
- The new Grade 10-12 provincial curriculum gives teachers significant flexibility to customize course content

#### Important Changes for 2018/19



• New and revised BAA courses may overlap Big Ideas and Curricular Competencies of provincial curricula, but cannot significantly overlap Content

#### Important Changes for 2018/19



 Boards/Authorities can volunteer to share their BAA frameworks through ERAC (Educational Resource Acquisition Consortium)

#### Important Changes for 2018/19



 Moving forward, periodic reviews of BAA courses will be required. The review cycle should be determined by the Board/Authority

#### **NVSD BAA Review Guidelines**




- Fall 2017 Secondary Admin/teachers determined which Grade 10 BAA courses would be offered this year
  - Courses were re-designed to fit the new BAA framework by June 2018
  - All other Grade 10 BAA course were archived and retired
  - Should a school determine at a future date that they would like to use a retired course, it will be reviewed, re-designed to the new BAA framework, and presented for approval at a future Board meeting
- 2018/19 Same process for the Grade 11 and 12 BAA courses
- Beginning September 2019, all BAA courses will be reviewed on a four year cycle
