#### A. Call to Order

Board Chair George Tsiakos called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. and acknowledged the traditional territorial lands of the Squamish Nation and Tsleil-Waututh Nation.

Carolyn Pena, President of North Vancouver Teachers' Association, thanked everyone involved in creating the Policy 412: Supporting Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity and Gender Expression – Administrative Procedures. Ms. Pena highlighted how important it is to continue supporting this process with time and resources for all employees and the ability to access high quality teaching resources.

### C.1. North Vancouver Teachers' Association Professional Development Report

Each year through the Collective Agreement; the Board of Education provides a grant to the North Vancouver Teachers' Association (NVTA) to fund professional development. Carolyn Pena, President of the NVTA and Tammy Daley, Chair of the Association's Professional Development Committee, were welcomed to present the NVTA Professional Development Report.

Ms. Daley shared the Report and highlighted that all teachers were eligible to apply for up to \$250 for professional development. Opportunities were provided for teachers to participate in larger, more expensive professional development activities with \$6,000 being allocated to special grants. Concluding the presentation, Ms. Daley thanked the Board of Education for the continued support.

On behalf of the Board, Chair Tsiakos thanked the NVTA team for their presentation.

### C.2. Policy 412: Supporting Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity and Gender Expression – Administrative Procedures

Vince White, Director of Instruction, was invited to share the administrative procedures for Policy 412: Supporting Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity and Gender Expression. The administrative procedures were drafted during a Policy 412 Policy Review Sub-committee with representatives from the secondary and elementary school administrators (NoVA), the North Vancouver Teachers' Association (NVTA), the North Vancouver Parent Advisory Council (NVPAC) and the Board of Education.

Dr. White provided highlights of the administrative procedures that were updated to reflect the changes of structure and language. This important work will help increase visibility and awareness of sexual orientation and gender identity by acknowledging national and international days of recognition; through school announcements; making available books and resources for teachers;

### C.2. Policy 412: Supporting Sexual Orientation, Gender Identity and Gender Expression – Administrative Procedures (continued)

building gender-neutral washroom options in new constructions and renovations; and, examining existing and new school activities.

Trustees shared their thanks and appreciation to Dr. White on taking on such an important and sensitive policy.

### C.3. Proposed Robotics Academy

District Principal Michael Kee provided the Board of Education with an overview of the Robotics, Mechatronics & Digital Fabrication Academy Proposal and the discussions that have occurred to date with respect to this proposal.

In the fall of 2019, the North Vancouver School District began exploring the possibility of a Robotics Academy, and in January 2020 initiated discussions with Zen Maker Lab to introduce a new specialty academy.

Mr. Kee shared that the academy would be open to all students regardless of experience in robotics. Interested students will have opportunities to participate in competitions as well as Career Education Work Experience placements related to robotics and mechatronics. Students interested in advancing in this area can, through the academy's connection to Zen Maker Lab, discover pathways from secondary school to post-secondary institutions and/or employment in the technology/industrial sector in North Vancouver and the Lower Mainland.

The intent is to offer the Academy at Carson Graham Secondary School and/or Zen Maker Lab's new Shipyards location beginning in the 2021/22 school year. As with other NVSD academies, the program would be offered during an afternoon block.

Responding to Trustees' questions, clarification was provided regarding the communications to ensure families within the School District are aware of the academy and sponsorships was explored to reduce the cost. It was noted that if there is a waitlist, like other academies, there will be a lottery process to offer acceptance.

Mr. Kee will come back to the Board of Education in March 2021 with enrolment numbers for the Robotics, Mechatronics & Digital Fabrication Academy.

### C.4. School Calendar 2021/22 – Update

Assistant Superintendent Chris Atkinson provided the Board of Education with an update on the work that has been completed with the proposed school calendar for the 2021/22 school year. The 2021/22 calendar proposal developed by the School District's School Calendar Committee will be published, for comment, to the School District website from February 1, 2021, till February 28, 2021.

#### C.5. Land Management Update

Superintendent Pearmain updated the Board of Education on the Argyle and Handsworth Secondary School Replacement Projects, the Mountainside Secondary Seismic Upgrade and the status of Cloverley Elementary School.

A short break was observed.

### C.6. Tuesday, January 12, 2021, Standing Committee Meeting

Trustee Mann reported on the meeting that showcased the Museum and Archives of North Vancouver and a presentation from the North Vancouver School District's Inclusive Education team and Indigenous Education team.

### C.7. Superintendent's Report (including COVID-19)

Superintendent Pearmain provided an update on COVID-19 which included the number of exposures in the North Vancouver School District since the beginning of the school year. An update on the Elementary Temporary Transition Support Option was provided to the Board, with notification that a recommendation would be coming forward in February. Superintendent Pearmain also shared information regarding the concept of a Student Trustee and acknowledged Black Shirt Day.

#### Narration:

The Board is being asked to adopt an Amended Annual Budget Bylaw for Fiscal Year 2020/21. Section 113 of the *School Act* provides the authority for a Board to amend its annual budget bylaw. The Amended Budget is the final budget for the 2020/21 fiscal year and includes numerous budget variations that have taken place since the adoption of the 2020/21 Preliminary Budget on June 23, 2020.

In the 2020/21 Amended Annual Budget, the revenue has been increased by \$10,049,908 over the Preliminary Annual Budget. Significant adjustments include an increase to the Operating Grant budget by \$952,724 as a result of higher than anticipated enrollment. The School District received \$1,116,823 from the Provincial Government for the Safe Return to Class Grant, and \$6,187,532 from the Federal Government for the Safe Return to School Grant. Both grants were received to support the School District with revenue and expense impacts resulting from COVID-19. The Classroom Enhancement Fund Grant was increased by \$2,001,296 to fund the provisions of restored contract language and Remedy expense. International Student Tuition fee revenue has been increased by \$1,403,300 as a result of higher than anticipated international student enrollment.

Total planned expenditures have increased by \$4,039,489. This is largely attributed to an increase in staffing and facility maintenance expenses resulting from the implementation of COVID-19 health and safety plans, as well as additional teacher staffing to support learning and the elementary temporary transition support option. The Amended Budget incorporates the utilization of \$2,271,193 of the Accumulated Operating Surplus to balance the Operating Budget. In addition, \$4,350,000 has been included as a transfer to local capital reserves to support District capital construction projects and future investments in information technology and communications.

Schedules 2, 3, and 4 provide details of the Operating, Special Purpose, and Capital Funds, respectively.

The Total Budget Bylaw amount is \$206,792,467. The Amended Annual Budget includes a balanced Operating Fund and a surplus in the Capital Fund of \$3,285,826.

Kristen Watson, Director of Financial Services will be in attendance to speak to the 2020/21 Amended Annual Budget.

#### Narration:

On August 26, 2020, the North Vancouver School District shared its Stage 2 Restart Plan with families. The Plan outlined the measures we are taking, in accordance with the recommendations of the Provincial Health Officer (PHO) and the Ministry of Education (MOE), to ensure a safe return to schools for all students in September and throughout Stage 2 of BC's Five Stage Framework for K-12 Education.

While we are confident that the Occupational Health and Safety Guidelines and Learning Cohort Model outlined in our Restart Plan provides a safe and healthy environment in all schools, we also recognize that some students and families required a longer transition period to in-person learning in schools.

The Elementary Temporary Transition Support Option was designed and launched on September 24, 2020, to provide students with the opportunity to participate in a learning model that incorporated online, self-directed and face-to-face learning opportunities. This model of instructional support was specifically designed to help students transition back to in-person learning in their home school by December 18, 2020.

At the Public Meeting held December 8, 2020 meeting, the Board of Education confirmed further extension of the Elementary Temporary Transition Support Option to Spring Break 2021, based on the expressed needs of families.

Assistant Superintendent Pius Ryan will provide a brief update and review of the Transition Support Option.

#### **Land Management Update**

### Argyle Secondary School: Replacement Update

Phase 2 is now commencing with the removal of hazardous materials and deconstruction of the existing school. We expect the old gymnasium to be demolished commencing in two weeks.

### Handsworth Secondary School: Replacement Update

Construction activity of new school is approximately 51% (at end of January) complete overall with construction activity progressing from west to east. The west part of the structure is most advanced.

- West section of building:
  - Exterior wall finishes are being installed;
  - Exterior windows have been installed;
  - Roofing is complete;
  - Interior partitions and door frames being installed;
  - Main mechanical and electrical distribution systems are in place.
- Centre section of building:
  - Structural steel has been erected and secured:
  - Exterior wall sheathing has commenced;
  - Interior walls are being framed.
- East section of building:
  - Underground servicing and foundations have been installed;
  - Structural steel has been erected and secured;
  - · Roofing has been completed;
  - Gym concrete floor has been poured;
  - Interior and Exterior wall framing are being installed.

### Mountainside Secondary School: Seismic Upgrade

Estimated progress to date 50%

- Block 1A (Academic Wing) final occupancy expected by the end of March
  - New Siding installation 95% complete.
- Work is currently proceeding on:
  - Building formworks for two buttresses located on far east side of the school;
  - Interior plumbing, electrical rough-ins, prepping for dry-walling work to start.
- Block 1B (Learning Services)
  - Work will commence in April.
- Block 2 (Gymnasium)
  - 2 exterior concrete walls are completed:
  - Siding completed approximately 90% complete;
