


Why is having a concussion policy important?



We recognize . . .

- children/youth are vulnerable to injury and take longer to recover
- injury and recovery experiences are variable
- concussion symptoms can significantly impair learning and functioning at school (and home)
- when concussion signs and symptoms are not recognized, and when recovery is not managed in recommended ways, catastrophic injuries can occur resulting in permanent disability and death





How (in what ways) did the policy evolve in committee?

- Students and Staff
- Students have a varied ability to participate in the process
