2020/21 FORECAST TO JUNE 2021



- Amended Budget Bylaw for 2020/21 was approved on February 23, 2021.
- Total Budget Bylaw \$206,792,467.
- No material changes to forecast.
- Q3 forecast to Ministry due April 14.

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2021/22 OPERATING GRANT



Highlights:

- September forecast 15,155 students; 176 or 1.15% decrease
- Basic allocation per student \$7,885; \$325 increase
- \$145,310,826 estimated at March 12, 2021
- Includes \$91,662 for enrolment decline
- · Adjustments based on actual enrolments
- Updates received December 2021 and March 2022

PUBLIC INPUT ON BUDGET



Between February 3 and March 12, 2021, the North Vancouver School District launched an exchange to gather public input to inform our decisions on the building of the 2021/22 budget.

We asked students, staff, parents/guardians and community members to answer the following question:

*The NVSD is currently refining the draft goals for the 2021-2031 Strategic Plan, goals which have been shaped through community input.

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RESULTS



Overall. The budget exchange involved 42 participants. A total of 45 thoughts were shared, which received 461 ratings.

<u>Note:</u> According to Thoughtexchange, participation in surveys at school districts in 2020/21 has been high when the topic is COVID-19 related; when the topic is non-COVID-19 related (e.g. budget), participation has decreased.

RESULTS



Participation. Of those who answered this question, 76% were parents/guardians, 14% were staff, 5% were community members and 5% were "other."





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RESULTS



Themes. Overall, the feedback fell into the following themes: mental health and well-being; staffing, outdoor learning, arts education, curriculum implementation, inclusive education, technology, facilities, safe and active travel and sustainability.

When considering the ratings of importance, themes from highest to lowest are as follows:

 Outdoor learning 	7 thoughts 19 raters 3.5 rating
 Arts education 	1 thought 17 raters 3.4 rating
 Curriculum Implementation 	8 thoughts 17 raters 3.3 rating
 Inclusive education 	5 thoughts 9 raters 3.2 rating
 Technology 	3 thoughts 19 raters 3.1 rating
 Facilities 	1 thought 2 raters 3.0 rating
 Safe and active travel 	2 thoughts 16 raters 3.0 rating
 Sustainability 	1 thought 15 raters 3.0 rating

PARTNER GROUP SUBMISSIONS



- Extract from written submission
 - 1. Increase elementary administrative time by 0.10 FTE at each elementary school site. Total ask is 2.50 FTE with total cost approximately \$250,000.
 - 2. Increase Instructional Learning Fund monies for all NoVA members by an additional \$500 per year (with a total amount allocation of \$1000 per NoVA member per year). Total ask for this addition is approximately \$44,000.
