FRENCH IMMERSION at Argyle, Handsworth and Windsor - Gr. 8-12

Students enrolled in French Immersion continue their French language acquisition at the secondary level upon completion of the elementary French Immersion program. The goal of the program is to produce well-educated, functionally bilingual students who wish to develop a high level of proficiency in both official languages. In order to support this goal, in grades 8-10, French language instruction represents 35-50% of instruction and then gradually decreases to 25% for Grades 11 and 12. *It is important to note that students can be enrolled in French Immersion AND participate in other academies offered at various schools.
