SchoolMessenger – Cross-enrolled students

Together to Twenty: Energy target update

A key component of the school district's overall Sustainability Strategy is effective and efficient use of energy. NVSD is targeting a 20% reduction in energy by 2020, relative to our 2010 baseline. The "finish line" for this target is June 30, 2020 – which is only 9 months away! We have made good progress towards the target, but are not there yet. As of June 30, 2019, we were at 18% savings; there is only 2% to go! To help us get over the finish line we will be running a district-wide "Together to Twenty" campaign from November to March. Schools will be encouraged to run at least one of their own energy-related campaigns during this time and will have the flexibility to choose from the following:

- Lights out
- Holiday Shutdown (Winter Break)
- Winter Heating (e.g., Sweater Day)
- Energy Education Fortis and BC Hydro
- Printing Challenge

Board of Education passes Climate Emergency motion

At the September 24, 2019, Board of Education public meeting, the following motion was passed: *That North Vancouver School District declare a climate emergency and support our students and teachers in their endeavours in educating our community on climate change and the impact it has on our environment and that the Board of Education direct the Superintendent to develop a measurable plan to reduce further our carbon footprint as a school district and that this plan be reviewed every calendar year; and that the Board of Education direct the Superintendent to reach out to both North Vancouver District and City of North Vancouver about developing a task force where we jointly can work together to reduce our carbon footprint.*

And

That staff be directed to explore opportunities to make the replacement school at Cloverley an ecodemonstration school and report their findings back to the Board of Education.
