2021/2022 School Calendar Update

The Collective Agreement in place between the North Vancouver Teachers' Association (NVTa) and the School District provides the NVTa the right to select the three dates each year on which all schools across the district collectively schedule the same Professional



Development days. For the 2021/2022 school year, the dates for the three *district-wide* Professional Development days are:

- Friday, October 22, 2021
- Friday, February 4, 2022
- Monday, May 9, 2022

Additionally, the 2021/2022 School Calendar has been *amended to remove* the previously displayed four Staff Collaboration Days. Next year's calendar will not include Staff Collaboration (shortened school day) dates as the School District and NVTAs were unable to reach agreement regarding inclusion of scheduled Staff Collaboration Time for the 2021/2022 school year.

The two school-based Professional Development dates will be selected by the NVTAs Staff Committee at each school and will be confirmed by the end of May. Each school will publish their complete, school-specific calendar by May 31.

COVID-19 Mouth Rinse/Gargle Test Kits

BC Children's Hospital and Vancouver Coastal Health have made COVID-19 Mouth Rinse/Gargle test kits available at schools for students who become symptomatic during the school day. This test kit provides an at-home testing option, and the specimen is dropped off at a local LifeLabs or to BC Children's Hospital for processing (instructions are provided with each kit). Families are still required to complete the [Daily Health Check](#) for their child **prior** to sending them to school; kits will be available to parents/guardians should students become ill with two or more COVID-19 symptoms while at school. Acceptance of a kit is voluntary.

***Alertable* Public Alerting System: Sign Up Now**

Residents and visitors to the North Shore are encouraged to sign up for *Alertable*, which is used by [North Shore Emergency Management](#) (NSEM) to send out alerts for emergencies (e.g. severe weather, natural disasters, industrial hazards, transportation accidents or marine spills). By signing up, you will also receive an alert if you need to evacuate, shelter-in-place or if there is an Amber Alert. Notifications are fast, reliable and easy to see and hear.
