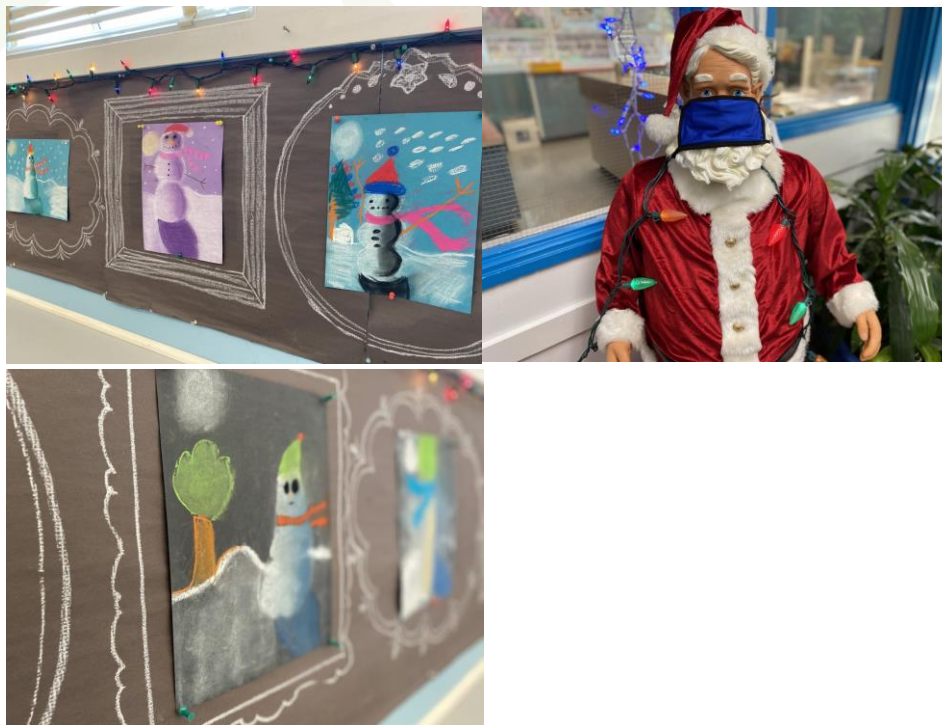
- Grade 7 students from Ridgeway Elementary are bringing holiday cheer to their school community this week during School Spirit Week.

Policy 310: Concussion Awareness, Prevention and Management

The Board of Education places a high priority on establishing and maintaining a safe and healthy environment for all students. Through its approval of new [Policy 310: Concussion Awareness, Prevention and Management](#) at the December 8, 2020, Public Board Meeting, the Board acknowledges the need to provide individuals working with students with guidance in the areas of concussion awareness, prevention and management.

The new policy and administrative procedures were created through a sub-committee led by Adam Baumann and Beverly Beckingham, and reviewed through the Policy Review Committee comprised of Trustees Tsiakos and Gerlach, representatives from the secondary and elementary school administrators (NOVA), North Vancouver Teachers' Association (NVTa), Canadian Union of Public Employees (CUPE Local 389), North Vancouver Parent Advisory Council (NVPAC) and District Student Leadership Council (DSLc).
