

1. Student Safety to/from School

We are pleased to see most students walking or biking to school. We are reminding students through PA announcements but appreciate your help in reiterating the importance of using sidewalks, crosswalks, and being alert while walking.

A reminder that access to the school via the driveway/parking lot is limited and there is no student parking on site. The parking lot is for staff, tradespeople, and visitors only. There is no student drop off permitted in the parking lot except for students who need support in their entry to school. We request that parents drop off students at the locations indicated on the map below except for students who need support in their entry to school. Please consider meeting your child a block or two away from the school to decrease congestion on the roadways around Argyle, and to increase the safety for students. Note that Argyle Road is an exit only from the parking lot; this is not a recommended pickup/drop off point as the road is small and many students use this as an access point on foot. Also, please be respectful of our neighbours by not stopping or parking in front of their driveways and abiding by all traffic signs.



2. February is Black History Month

In February, the North Vancouver School District and Argyle Secondary School will celebrate Black History month. As we lead or join activities that support the learning of our collective history we will strive to better understand the contributions and struggles of BIPOC Canadians, which will include a broader dialogue of racism and civil rights.



As a lead up to Black History Month, today many of our students and staff are recognizing Black Shirt Day as an initiative to raise awareness of Black history, including the civil rights struggles that Black and racialized people have had to, and continue to face.

At Argyle, we are supportive of this anti-racism campaign, which also marks the birthday of Martin Luther King Jr., a champion and key figure for the Civil Rights Movement. The day celebrates King's birthday and his legacy as a leader of nonviolent activism during the Civil Rights Movement, with successful protests against racial discrimination.

We will continue to highlight Argyle's activities and learnings as the month progresses. Public education plays a critical role in ensuring this dialogue happens in a safe and healthy way for all. We are pleased that our schools and PACs have and continue to take a leadership role by supporting our communities with resources, tools, and opportunities to engage in dialogue and learning, together.

3. Non-medical Face Masks

We are still handing out quite a few masks every day to students who have forgotten their personal ones. We ask for your assistance in ensuring that your child leaves each morning with a mask on, and an extra in their bag.

4. Yearbooks

From Monday January 18th until Friday January 22nd, the student portraits for the 2020-21 Argyle Yearbook will be available for students to view in windows of the main office and nearby rooms. If a student's photo is missing this is because their <u>Personal Information Consent Form</u>



has not been completed. To remedy this, students can speak to office staff. The most common reason is because the Personal Informed Consent Form has not been completed through School Cash Online – this was one of the September start-up forms. An updated portrait section will be displayed the following week, including the students who have since submitted their form. If a student's Personal Information Consent Form is not submitted their picture will **not** be included in the yearbook.

This is also an opportunity for students to ensure that their name is spelled correctly (or to address any other issues with the name as written), and that the preferred photo or retake is used. If there are any issues with the above, students can email argyle.yb@sd44.ca stating what they would like resolved or visit Mr. Altrogge in room 137 between 9:00-9:30AM on any school day.

Please note that <u>the Yearbook will only be available for purchase until January 31st.</u> If you want to receive a yearbook, it must be paid for before this date. Purchases can be made online on your student's School Cash Online account (<u>SchoolCashOnline.com</u>: <u>Welcome</u>).

5. <u>Grade 11 Students – January 2021 Numeracy 10 Graduation Assessment Schedule</u>

The Grade 11's were unable to write their Numeracy 10 Provincial Assessment last April due to COVID. This January 2021 session, we will offer sittings to about 2/3 of our Grade 11's as outlined below. We must keep the students in their cohorts so we are offering limited in-cohort sittings for January. Students not scheduled to write in the January session will be scheduled to write in the April 2021 session.

Students are encouraged to read the information and do the sample assessments posted on the Ministry of Education website here.
