
WHAT IS A TRADE?


The Skilled trades are occupations that require a special skill, knowledge or ability which can be obtained through a combination Technical training and Work Experience. Skilled trades provide an alternative to jobs that require four years of college education. They are generally divided into the following categories: Manufacturing, Transportation, Construction and Service.

INDUSTRY TRAINING AUTHORITY (ITA)

- Manages BC's industry trades training and certification system
- Works with employers, employees, industry, labour, training providers, and governments to increase opportunities in the trades
- There are more than 100 apprenticeship training programs in BC, including 49 Red Seal trades
- Funds & oversees trades training programs to high schools and post secondary institutions across BC
- The ITA Youth team oversees youth apprentices who are under 20 years old and taking some form of trades programming through the high school, or post secondary systems



WHO IS THE ITA YOUTH TEAM?

- Youth team consists of 4 members
- Annual budget of \$8.3M
- Engage with 60 districts, First Nations & Independent schools
- Closely connected with Ministry of Education
- Separate funding stream to support trades training in BC

ITA'S STRATEGIC PLAN AND MANDATE

ITA's Four Goals

- Build diversity in trades training
- Connect Apprentices with employers
- Enhance access to services
- Work with key partners to increase system performance

- 120 hour, 4 credit course for students in Grades 9 -12
- Consists of four modules (approx. 30 hours each) that introduce students to trades careers through hands-on learning, leads well into work experience
- Core Module + 3 more

- 300+ hour (10-12 week) program covering 5+ different trades
- In depth experience in each trade delivered in partnership with a post secondary school
- Workforce certificates possibly included: First Aid, Fall Protection, Forklift Operator...
- Modules are selected from a pre-approved list to meet local/regional needs based on economics, job opportunities and interest




- Technical training component of an apprenticeship
- Students are registered with the ITA and take a Foundation or Level 1 technical training program through a designated training provider
- Dual credit program earns both secondary school graduation and technical credit towards trade certification
- 12+ course codes available: TRN12a, 12b, 12c, 12d.....
- Student Eligibility: Focus on grades 11 and 12

Focus on work




- Work-based component of an apprenticeship
- Students are registered with the ITA as a youth apprentice (employer sponsored) and accumulate hours towards a trade (need 480 hours)
- Dual credit program earns both secondary school graduation and hours towards trade certification
- 4 course codes available up to 16 credits: WRK11a, 11b, 12a, 12b
- Student Eligibility: School aged, registered by June 30th of the school year they turn 19
- Students eligible for \$1000 award if they meet criteria



WHAT IS AN APPRENTICESHIP?

A trade apprenticeship is how you gain the knowledge and skills you need for a career in your trade. Most apprenticeships take about four years to complete. You'll spend approximately six to eight weeks per year in the classroom or shop learning from an instructor. The rest of the year, you'll earn while you learn, working on a job site alongside experienced tradespeople and getting paid to do it.

FUNDING/PROGRAM SUMMARY

Funds:







Dual Registration Grant:

\$500 to the District for any student registered in both Train and Work

- A Grant agreed upon by ITA and schooloften \$10-\$20/student. Up to \$15,000 Total
- \$100/\$250 per student registration

- \$1200 per registration and \$1000 per completion of program
- \$1000 Award for the student, tax credit for employer. \$10k, \$20k, \$30k or \$40k in funding based on application and district size. \$5000 performance award for top district in region (8 awards across BC)


