Traffic Safety – Drop-Off

Over the first few weeks of school, there has been an increase in traffic situations around Boundary Elementary. On a daily basis, we are seeing parents dropping their children off in the staff parking lot, stopping in the middle of the crosswalk to drop-off, blocking our neighbours' driveways to drop-off, as well as stopping in the middle of the road to drop-off. All these actions are putting all our children and staff at risk just to save a few seconds or minutes.

When dropping off, please do so at the front of the school and pull up to the first pylon if you are the first car. If you are the next car, please pull up to the car in front; others may be waiting behind you. If everyone is following these procedures, five or six cars can drop-off at once.

There should be no parking immediately in front of the school and the drop-off should not take more than 15-30 seconds. Please do your part to keep everyone safe at Boundary.

This is just a reminder that the speed limit on William around Boundary is 30 km/hr from 8am to 5pm.
