Dear Boundary Families,

This past week has been a busy one at Boundary. We had a full week of focussed classroom instruction and as the weather dried out a bit, students enjoyed some drier outdoor play. Our outdoor spaces are vast and varied and students have many safe, supervised places in which to play. We also have a skilled group of older students who are available at recess and lunch to connect with younger students, help them find things to do, have conversations, and help them sort out small social challenges on the playground. We wanted to make sure that we acknowledged the important work that these "Peer Counsellors" do on the playground and in the classrooms as students prepare to head outside for fresh air and play. These leaders contribute greatly to Boundary's social learning community.

Play is a vital part of student learning and at times children need guidance and direct instruction on how to play with others. Cooperative and social play often involve taking the perspective of another, using problem-solving skills, being patient if a plan changes, and regulating big emotions if things change during a play experience. These skills are being taught at every grade level and as students grow older, these play skills can be applied in future collaborative and cooperative relationships.

This weekend had some beautiful sunny stretches along with some very chilly temperatures. We hope that everyone was able to get outside for some physical and social play this weekend – forest adventures, a ball hockey game, some fort building, bike and scooter adventures, skipping rope! We expect this chilly weather to continue this coming week so please ensure that your child is prepared.


