Dear Boundary Families,

Well, the recent snowfall has almost all washed away, as it usually does on the West Coast. We wanted to make sure we thanked all the parent, staff, and student volunteers who worked rapidly in the early morning hours this past Sunday, and throughout the week. We are so grateful for the community responsiveness at Boundary! It is a rare event that the North Vancouver School District calls a "Snow Day" and closes schools due to safety concerns. We know this can sometimes be a hardship to families, and we greatly appreciate your flexibility. We also hope you were able to enjoy the brief 'fluffy stuff' before the rain fell. The local coastal snowpack has been minimal this past year, so we are also grateful for this winter event, as it will contribute to the fresh drinking water supply in the coming months.

Despite the slightly shorter week at Boundary, it has been a very busy one. All K-7 classes participated in the "Body Science and Sexual Health" workshops on Thursday and Friday. Students were engaged throughout the sessions, and they asked excellent questions! The presenter, Julie, commented that this community of students were quite mature and curious about the science and the personal safety topics covered. Students were encouraged to talk to trusted adults about any further questions they might have. Parents play a most vital role in ensuring children get the correct information that works for their family, but we might not always be prepared with the answers. Please continue to access the resources previously sent out to families whenever needed.

This coming week is the final week of classes before we break for 2 weeks. Please ensure you have signed up for a conference with your child's teacher. Please note that the format for conferences will be different from class to class. This is an excellent time to reflect on your child's learning so far this school year, and to set some goals for continued growth for the balance of this year. Celebrate, encourage, and let your child know that learning can be hard work, but it

can also lead to new adventures, new skills, and deep satisfaction. Be a learner alongside your child and continue to keep in touch with your child's teacher and with other community opportunities to help with this important, life-long journey.

British Columbia Training & Education Savings Grant Information

In British Columbia, families are encouraged to start early planning and financial preparation for their children's post-secondary education or training programs. To aid with this effort, the B.C. Government will provide \$1,200 to qualifying children via the B.C. Training and Education Savings Grant (BCTESG).

Children can request the grant between their 6th birthday and the day before they turn 9. Both the child and the parent or guardian must reside in British Columbia at the time of application and possess a valid Social Insurance Number. (http://bit.ly/3yg7zsM)

Nut Aware

We would like to take this opportunity to remind everyone that École Boundary is a nut aware school. This means that while we are not a nut-free school, we strive to minimize the risk of nut exposure to our students with severe nut allergies.

bottles, and milk and other recyclable cartons using the Return It Express system at any time. At the Express Kiosk, enter the following code; 604 903 3260 (the school phone number).

Then, print off a label, stick onto your clear bag of recycling, remember to scan the barcode! and deposit the bag. Note that we are unable to use the bin drop off at an Express-and-Go location (e.g. in the Superstore car park), as the access procedure for the bins was changed and only the account holder may access. Please return to a depot (e.g. opposite Park & Tilford).


