A MESSAGE FROM MS. LA ROUE and MS. WARDAS

This week we began each day with morning announcements that celebrate and recognize the achievements and contributions of Black Canadians. For the month of February, we will learn about Black North Americans who worked against enormous challenges to make our communities welcoming, culturally diverse, prosperous and inclusive. In 2024 the theme is "CHANGEMAKERS", highlighting the courage of people who have and continue to strive for freedoms that many of us take for granted. People of African descent have been a part of shaping Canada's heritage and identity since the arrival of Mathieu Da Costa, a navigator and interpreter, whose presence in Canada dates back to the early 1600s. Did you know that:

- **Barbara Howard** ran internationally for Canada as a sprinter when she was only in Grade 11? She also became the first Black teacher in Vancouver!
- Willie O'Ree was the first Black athlete to play in the NHL?
- Ainara Alleyene, a Grade 6 student from Hamilton, Ontario, has an Instagram account that features and celebrates books with Black characters?
- Oscar Peterson was touted as one of the WORLD'S BEST jazz planists EVER!

And with the support of Mrs. Oucherak, Ms. Eadon, and Mrs. Wardas, we have booked some incredible artists/speakers to come to Boundary at the end of February to present important historical information through the arts - Black History Matters. The presenters work with North Vancouver's Presentation House Theatre.
