WE THOUGHT YOU"D LIKE TO KNOW...

Another busy week at Boundary ended with an amazing performance by the Argyle Choir. It is fabulous to listen to the talent and joy of former Boundary students and students from the Argyle Family of Schools.

Continuing with our Black History Month learning, last week we focussed on the contributions of:

Viola Desmond in 1946 in Nova Scotia, Canada. Born in 1914 to mixed parents (her father was Black and her mother was Caucasian), she was one of 10 children. In 1946, Viola Desmond challenged racial discrimination when she refused to leave the segregated Whites-only section of the Roseland Theatre in New Glasgow, Nova Scotia. On December 9, 2016 Viola Desmond became the FIRST Canadian woman to appear on a banknote (the \$10 bill). Beside her picture is an excerpt from the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms* "Every individual is equal before and under the law and has the right to the equal protection and equal benefit of the law without discrimination."

Emma Stark, became the first Black teacher on Vancouver Island at age 18. Her mother, Sylvia, was a living legend. People loved gathering to hear stories of her childhood. She lived to be 106 years old! "Maharaja" is a Sanskrit word for GREAT RULER. Oscar Peterson, a Canadian jazz pianist, virtuoso and composer has been called the "Maharaja of the keyboard". Born in Montreal in 1925 to immigrant parents from the West Indies, Oscar was "wowing" musicians with his ability on the piano by the time he was 9 years old! Is anyone interested in finding some GOLD? BC's first dentist sure was! William Allen Jones was the FIRST dentist in BC to be granted a licence under the British Columbia Dental Act. He was a Black pioneer who originally moved to Saltspring Island with his two brothers.

Student Learning Survey 2023/2024

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians/caregivers, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.

Early in **2024** the Student Learning Survey will be administered to students in grades __ and __, their parents/guardians/caregivers, and all school staff. We encourage parents/guardians/caregivers to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the Province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included.

The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at http://www.bced.gov.bc.ca/sat_survey. Any computer with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link with or without an anonymous logon code by selecting the school district and school name where your child attends school. Provincial, District and School Reports for previous years can be viewed at the same site under the *Results* section.

The e-survey site will be open until May 3rd.
