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Carol LaFayette-Boyd ran to clock a 35.7 sec. world record in the 200 meters at the World Masters Track and Field Championships. Oh, and did we mention... she is 80 years old!!

Named the WORLD Masters' Track and Field Athlete of the year in 2022, Carol hails from Regina Saskatchewan. She started running when she turned 50 years old and has gone on to break multiple world records. Have you ever dreamed of representing Canada at the OLYMPIC GAMES?

How about qualifying for BOTH summer and winter Olympic Games... AND WINNING A MEDAL at one of those games? Phylicia George can give you some advice on how to do just that! First, she became internationally renowned as a 100m hurdler, qualifying for back-to-back Olympic finals at London 2012 and Rio 2016.

Communication includes understanding information that someone else shares and then asking connecting questions and adding your own creative thoughts. Listening to understand allows your imagination to connect with what the other person is saying. Donatella Versace says that "Creativity comes from a conflict of ideas". Creative conflict can be a very good thing - leads to innovation

Good communicators know that everyone has their own point of view. Good communicators respect other points of view and can disagree respectfully. They can agree to disagree.

Confident communicators act on the constructive feedback that they receive.

We've been learning about good communication this month. What are ways that you can communicate with others? Have you noticed that you can tell what people are saying just by looking at their body? This is called "body language" and sometimes our body can tell others if we are happy, sad, or angry.
