## **KEY ACTIONS**

- 1.1 To spotlight the Early Learning Years

UNIVERSAL -> SUPPORTS ALL STUDENTS

- Primary / EA staff will highlight early literacy with guided reading, decodable readers
- Primary Staff will study BC's Early Learning Framework
- Primary Staff will highlight phonological awareness with programs including Heggerty and Two Peas in a Pod.

- Primary Staff will implement the Early Learning Assessment K 3
- Primary staff / Admin / LST / Teacher Librarian will collaborate to administer ELA

TARGETED -> SUPPORTS MANY STUDENTS

- Kindergarten staff to apply for FOS collaborative grant to research and create early learning environments that fosters imagination, wonder, joy, and play.
- K / 1 Staff will learn about BC's Early Learning Framework, 2019
- -K / 1 Staff will participate in Early Numeracy workshops
- Kindergarten Staff to apply for NVSD Early Learning grant to research and create an K early learning environment that foster imagination, wonder, joy, and play.

INTENSIVE -> SUPPORTS SPECIFIC GROUPS OF STUDENTS

- Primary staff will plan a Carisbrooke Ready Set Learn event with targeted invites to incoming Kindergarten students.
- Primary staff will create Welcome to Kindergarten tote bag for incoming K students
- Teacher Librarian will offer Preschooler Storytime in the library

**UNIVERSAL -> SUPPORTS ALL STUDENTS** 

- Staff / Admin will offer UDL workshop opportunity for Collaboration Day
- Staff will create UDL rubrics for instructional planning
- Staff / Admin will dedicate Professional Development time to UDL.
- Staff / Admin will dedicate Education Leadership time to UDL resources

To further expand Indigenous ways of knowing and First Peoples Principles of Learning into daily instruction.

UNIVERSAL -> SUPPORTS ALL STUDENTS

- -School will offer whole school indigenous presentations and learning opportunities
- Students / Staff will participate in a week-long Button Blanket residency
- -Staff will invite Indigenous Elders to share traditional stories, art, salmon blessing.

- Staff will consider Braiding Sweetgrass for Young Adults by Robin Wall Kimmerer a school -wide book club choice (one of three books)
- -School Library will consider purchasing a class set of copies of Braiding Sweetgrass for Young Adults.
- Staff with guidance from Squamish Nation and NVSD will begin process of finding an Indigenous school name.
- Staff/ Students will recognize and celebrate National Indigenous Peoples Day following suggestions from Indigenous Committee.
- Staff/ Students / Community will participate in Outdoor place-based garden program with a focus on ethno-botany using resources Braiding Sweetgrass for Young Adults and The Secret Lives of Trees by Moria Butterfield.
- Staff/ Students will access outdoor learning spaces and learning materials.

TARGETED -> SUPPORTS MANY STUDENTS

- Students / Staff will fulfil Downie-Wenjack work (bring to Indigenous committee)
- School Indigenous Education committee will meet monthly.

INTENSIVE -> SUPPORTS SPECIFIC GROUPS OF STUDENTS

- Interested Staff will learn about Teaching as Storytelling as an instructional strategy.
- 3 Mental Health and Well-Being

To support mental health, well-being, and a sense of belonging for students and staff.

**UNIVERSAL -> SUPPORTS ALL STUDENTS** 

- Staff will strengthen sense of community with cross grade connections, buddy classes, school wide events including Fall Hoe-Down and Winter Concert, assemblies, school-wide performances.
- Teacher Librarian will increase SOGI and other underrepresented resources in school library.
- Staff to increase sense of belonging by raising awareness of equity, diversity, and inclusion with regards to instruction, resources, activities, signage.
- Students / staff will 'give back' to North Shore community with Harvest House fundraiser at Winter Concert and Mountainside Giving Tree project.
- Staff will explore UDL unit planning to ensure every student may access curriculum.
- Staff / Students / Community to consider foods offered to students: foods to avoid /foods to serve as directed by VCH Guidelines to Serving Food in Schools.

- School will participate in the BC Fruits and Vegetables program.
- Students / staff / community will engage in School Garden program.
- Students / staff / community will promote litter-less lunches.
- -Admin. Staff / Parent Community will apply for Harvest Bin Project.
- Students / Staff will continue Zones of Regulation, Second Step, Minds Up.
- -Staff will learn about trauma informed practice via Ed Leadership, professional development, and targeted SEL workshops.
- School will purchase copy of the Myth of Normal by Gabor Maté.
- Admin / CPAC will collaborate and support Traffic Safety program.
- CPAC / School Staff will promote Carisbrooke Spirit Wear.

TARGETED -> SUPPORTS MANY STUDENTS

- Staff to organize and plan opportunities to connect outside of school such as hikes, bowling, snow shoeing, kayaking, and/ or social gatherings.
- Staff will consider schedule of treat days or lunches for staff members.
- Staff will plan a class 'Switch Day' for in April ( April Fool's Day fun .)
- Primary Staff will introduce 'Eating a Rainbow' lunch.
- Staff / Community will introduce class presentations on plant-based diets and the connection to environmental stainability.

INTENSIVE -> SUPPORTS SPECIFIC GROUPS OF STUDENTS

- -CPAC / Admin will invite VCH Head Dietician to speak at CPAC meeting
- Staff consider 'Onward –Cultivating Emotional Resilience in Educators book club by Elena Aguilar, as one of 3 book selections September 2023
- Staff consider The Myth of Normal by Gabor Maté as one of 3 book selections September 2023
