What is an Exit Interview?

- This is a presentation about you, your interests, passions, your educational/learning journey, your values, who has supported you, who has mentored you, who you would like to thank, challenges you have overcome, special achievements, awards, accomplishments, what are your future plans...



Set up, Presentation, Closing = 15 minutes

- ▶ Check the assigned room for your Exit Interview. This will be posted in counselling.
- ▶ Make sure a few days in advance that your technology will work in the assigned classroom for your exit interview.
- ▶ Do a test run if using technology in the school location a few days in advance.
- ▶ Presentation: Should be approximately 10 minutes
- ▶ Set up, questions and closing: Maximum 5 Minutes.
- ▶ Dress Code: Business: What you would wear to a job interview, however, think about career path. (For example: If you are a culinary student, perhaps wear chef jacket, or if you want to be a fireman, wear fire hat.)

Your INTRODUCTION is important, Start strong with:

- Let me introduce myself,
- My name is...
- Good afternoon, my name is...
- Hello, my name is...

Walk in, eye contact, handshake and tell the panel your name.

The “**EVA**” Principle

- good **E**ye contact, good **V**oice, loud and clear, good **A**pppearance.



(Who I Am?) Explain who you are in reference to one or more below:

- What are your interests, passions?
- What has been your educational/learning experience to date?
- What are some of my personal values, (i.e. what is important to me)
- What/Who has helped me to become who I am.
- What is an adversity/challenge that I have had to overcome,
- Who I would thank for their support, (i.e. family, friends, teachers)
- What I have achieved? What I know about myself? Where I am going?
- What are my future plans? Gap Year? Travel? University? College? Technical Program? Etc. Explain this choice in the interview



Pace yourself, not too fast! Breath/ Relax.

Your panel is there to hear and see something positive about you!

- When you are near the end of the presentation, please invite the panel to ask any questions. (These questions will usually be to clarify or elaborate.)
- Please thank the panel for listening and taking part in your exit interview.
