

Upcoming January Session for Graduation Assessments

This is a reminder to ALL Grade 10 students and ALL Semester 1 FRAL 12 students.

As per the message sent home on November 14th, 2023 all of our Grade 10s and our Grade 12s currently enrolled in FRAL 12 this semester, are required to write your Graduation Literacy Assessment in January.

The schedule for assessments is below. Please ensure you arrive to the Library Learning Commons no later than 15 minutes prior to the scheduled start time.

These assessments are mandatory for students graduating in BC.

YEARBOOK INFORMATION FOR 2024 GRADS PLEASE READ THIS CAREFULLY!

The information here is non-negotiable and all deadlines must be met – no exceptions.

Late submissions for anything will not be included.

- 1. GRAD WRITE-UPS and BABY PICTURES are optional.
- 2. You only get a GRAD WRITE-UP in the Yearbook if you have had a proper GRAD PHOTO in a gown taken at Artona.
- 3. If you do not get a proper Grad Photo with a gown, your Go-Card Picture will be used with no Grad Write-Up.
- 4. GRAD WRITE-UPS and BABY PICTURES for the Yearbook are due Thursday, February 15th, 2024. No late submissions will be included. To submit your WRITE-UP and BABY PICTURE, use the QR code or link available in the CLC 12 Teams under the "Grad Yearbook 2023-2024" channel. No submissions to teacher email or yearbook staff will be accepted.
- 5. GRAD WRITE-UPS can be a maximum of 350 characters including spaces, punctuation, letters, and numbers (NOTE that is 350 characters, NOT 350 words). Your write-up CANNOT have any abbreviations, initials, slang, social media handles/hashtags, timestamp TV episodes/movies, lyrics from explicit songs, bullying, innuendos, negative comments about the school or anything that is inappropriate for a school publication.
- You will not be contacted for a second opportunity to re-write your submission, should your
 write-up be rejected. If you include anything that is considered inappropriate for a school
 publication, you do not get to have a GRAD WRITE-UP. It will simply not be included, and you
 will not be notified.
- 7. **You have one submission** you cannot submit a GRAD WRITE-UP and then change or resubmit it this causes too much chaos and unnecessary work for the yearbook team.
- 8. Edit your GRAD WRITE-UP and have several people proof-read it! It will be in print forever!
- 9. BABY PICTURE must be submitted as a high-resolution jpeg. If you are scanning a picture, make sure that you crop it and submit it in the proper orientation.
- 10. PLEASE get your GRAD PHOTO taken between **December 12th-17th, 2023** during the times set aside for Handsworth Graduates. These dates are published in the school calendar. <u>If you need a retake, this must be done by February 2nd, 2024</u> and you will pay an additional sitting fee.
- 11. SHARE THIS INFO WITH ALL OF YOUR FRIENDS!! Too many late submissions did not get included last year.

12. There are 2 sections to the Grad section of the yearbook – make sure you read this carefully so that you know where you will be placed in the book.

There will be no exceptions made for students in terms of where they are placed in the year-book. You will be placed based on what you submit. Please contact Ms. Scott-Desfosses for clarification.

A. If you have had a proper GRAD PHOTO in a gown, you will be included alphabetically like this:



If NO WRITE-UP is received, yearbook staff will provide a message that will appear instead.

It's time to decorate for the holidays! For many families, this involves decorating their Christmas tree. But how can you ensure your tree is eco-friendly? First, don't buy plastic!



Maya Mount: Creating community and belonging for queer youth

Maya is a Grade 12 student at Handsworth Secondary and one of the co-leaders of the Handsworth Pride Club. A student leader with exceptional vision and drive, Maya truly understands the value of creating community and a sense of belonging for queer students.

Last spring, Maya applied for a grant from the organization It Gets Better, which supports queer youth. After hearing how many of his friends felt left out of grad events, he decided to apply for funds to put on a Queer Prom. It Get's Better generously awarded Maya with a grant of \$10,000 USD to organize this event.

Maya is a community activist, dedicated to social justice and inclusion. He has created partnerships with North Shore Restorative Justice and Project LETS (a disability rights organization) to make sure the event is accessible to all queer youth and allies on the North Shore.

Along with the monumental task of organizing the Prom, Maya has also organized a series of

monthly themed events for youth to get to know each other before the prom. He has also recently joined the board of directors for the Restorative Justice Association of British Columbia.

Maya brings his motto of "queer joy as resistance" to everything he does and is creating priceless experiences for young people across our community.
