

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2022-23 Advance Placement (AP) Exam Information



Registration & Payment Deadline for AP Exams – Extended!!

<u>Handsworth AP Students in Enrolling Classes</u>: Students enrolled in an AP course in a classroom at Handsworth will be asked to indicate whether they wish to write the AP exam for their course when they sign-in to their College Board Account and join their courses. AP teachers will walk students through this process in class and provide them with the "Join Code". <u>Students who do not want to write the AP exam for their course in May 2022, must let their teachers know by</u> <u>Wednesday, November 10th so that their exam order can be cancelled without a fee.</u> For those students writing their exam please be sure to pay your fees (\$150) online through your School Cash Online Account by noon on November 10th.

AP EXAMS CONT'D/DELTA CHALLENGE EXAM

For students who are completing courses through self-study and not within a Handsworth AP class, you will need to complete the following 3 steps by **Noon November 10th, 2022**:

Request an exam sitting by filling out the form using this link or the QR Code:



2. Pay an exam fee (\$250). For Handsworth Students pay through your School Cash Online Account, or if you are not a Handsworth student by providing a cheque to the Handsworth main office (made out to Handsworth Secondary School). If you decide not to write before November 15th there will be a \$50 processing fee. After November 15th there are no refunds for cancelled exams or exam no-shows.

3. Once you have completed the two steps above (form and payment), you will be emailed a "Join Code" to the e-mail address you have provided on the form. Once you have your "Join Code" you must then register yourself with the College Board to indicate you will be joining a "Self-Study" course section and will be writing the exam at Handsworth.

Delta Challenge Exam

ing signs, and current exploitation trends are taught through games,

activities, and multimedia.



November Parent Information Sessions: Keeping Kids Safe: Cybersafety and Sexual Exploitation Education

The school district and North Vancouver RCMP Youth Intervention Unit invite families* of students in Grades 9 and 10 to attend one of two 90-minute sessions from SEE happening this month. These sessions complement the presentations being delivered across the school district to students in Grades 9 and 10. Families will learn about digital consent, healthy boundaries, grooming warning signs, and exploitation trends happening through games, activities and multimedia (i.e., social media).

Participation is open to students in Grades 8-12 with intellectual disabilities or students who identify as having an intellectual disability, as well as autistic students. All students have the option to attend meetings with the support of a parent/guardian, sibling, peer or support person.



The sub-committee will meet at minimum three times per year, with meetings taking place after school.

16thAnnual Strachan Hartley Legacy Run



On Sunday, October 18, Handsworth hosted the 16thAnnual Strachan Hartley Legacy Run. The run started in 2007 in honour of Alumnus ('94) Dr Strachan Hartley who passed away from cancer in 2007 at age 30. Strachan was a stand-out student-athlete who benefited tremendously from the best sports and education programs. To honour his life goal of Making a Difference, his family and friends started a charitable foundation to give youth opportunities to reach their full potential through sports and education. The run is 100% volunteer-driven with all funds directed to the Streetfront programme on the Downtown Eastside.

After two virtual years, over 500 people returned to the brand-new campus and raised \$58,000. This shatters previous records by \$10,000 and brings the historical totals to over \$520,000 for underprivileged youth raised at the run.

Many Handsworth families ran, students on the football, volleyball, First Aid and Audio-visual clubs volunteered, and a group of Handsworth teachers, Principal Barrett and Vice-President Desai attended.

It was a spectacular day and we encourage others to join next year's version – the 17th.

The Strachan Hartley Legacy Foundation is profoundly grateful to Handsworth for its continued support of this special community event.






