Provincial Grad Assessments-Grade 11 & 12's

Oct 31st & Nov 1st

The first Grad Assessment period is reserved for <u>ALL our grade 11s and 12s who have NOT met</u> their Graduation 10 Assessment requirements.

The assessments will run from 8:30am – 11:30am and 12:30-3:30 pm in the Library Learning Commons.

Students must arrive no later than 15 minutes PRIOR to their assessment start time.

Students MUST remain in the assessment space for one hour, but will be sent back to classes once they complete the assessment – they have three hours to complete the assessments.

REPORT CARDS & THE NEW MINISTRY STUDENT REPORTING POLICY

Handsworth Semester One Interim Report Cards will be published to the MyEd Parent Portal on Monday, November 20th.

Starting this year, BC is working with a new Ministry Student Reporting Policy. The B.C. curriculum is flexible and focuses on literacy, numeracy, and the First Peoples Principles of Learning. At Handsworth, and across the province, Communicating Student Learning (the Report Card) gives students, parents, and caregivers a clear understanding of what students can already do and areas for future growth. Classroom assessment and reporting is focused on student proficiency in relation to the established learning standards, student engagement, and deeper learning that transfers into life outside the classroom.

One of the biggest changes to note is for our Grade 8 and 9 students. Below is the Provincial Proficiency Scale that you will now see on Report Cards to indicate where your student is in their learning journey in each course. Below is a description of the proficiency scale indicators that teachers are using in classes and on reports.

The Provincial Proficiency Scale

If your child is in Grades K-9, you won't see letter grades on their report card. Instead, you will see information on where your child is on the Provincial Proficiency Scale. The scale uses the terms "Emerging," "Developing," "Proficient," and "Extending" to describe student learning. The scale maintains high standards for student learning.

Emerging	Developing	Proficient	Extending
Emerging means your child is beginning to understand something in an area of learning. They are still learning but may need more support to move ahead. Emerging doesn't mean your child is unsuccessful in this area.	Developing means your child understands some things in an area of learning but still has other areas to work on. Like Emerging, it doesn't mean your child is unsuccessful in this area.	Proficient is the goal for your child. It's also the goal for all students. When your child is Proficient, it means they fully understand the required learning. But it doesn't mean their learning stops.	Extending is when students show a deeper understanding. It's when your child is able to apply their learning in new and different ways. Extending is not the goal for all students in every area of learning.

Handsworth AP Students in Enrolling Classes:

Students enrolled in an AP course in a classroom at Handsworth will be asked to indicate whether they wish to write the AP exam for their course when they sign-in to their College Board Account and join their courses. AP teachers will walk students through this process in class and provide them with the "Join Code". <u>Students who do not want to write the AP exam for their course in May 2024</u>, must let their teachers know by Monday, November 1st so that their exam order can be cancelled without a fee. For those students writing their exam, please be sure to pay your fees (\$160) online through your School Cash Online Account by November 1st.

For students who are completing courses through self-study and not within a Handsworth AP class, you will need to complete the following 3 steps by **November 1st, 2023:**

1. Request an exam sitting by filling out the form using this <u>link</u> or the QR Code:



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2. Pay an exam fee (\$270) through the School Cash Online link emailed to you after completing the request form. If you decide not to write before November 15th there will be a \$50 processing fee. **After November 15th there are no refunds for cancelled exams or exam no-shows.**

3. Once you have completed the two steps above (form and payment), you will be emailed a "Join Code" to the e-mail address you have provided on the form. Once you have your "Join Code" you must then register yourself with the College Board to indicate you will be joining a "Self-Study" course section and will be writing the exam at Handsworth.

October 17th-Handsworth Welcomed Students from Japan!

Handsworth has a long history, over 30 years, of welcoming Japanese students as part of our long running Exchange program with Inage High School, our sister school, in Chiba, Japan. Unfortunately Inage has not been able to visit since COVID, but on October 17th Handsworth was excited to welcome 63 students and 5 teacher chaperones from Hayato Yokohama Senior High School in Yokohama, Japan.

Over 70 Handsworth students volunteered to have a Japanese "buddy" accompany them to their Period 3 & 1 classes so that the Japanese students could see what Canadian high school classes and life are like. Our guests got to see a wide range of classes from Physical and Health Education, Technology, English, French Immersion, Science and Math.

At lunch, Handsworth and Japanese students enjoyed a pizza lunch while having the opportunity to hang out and discuss the differences of growing up in North Vancouver and Yokohama, Japanese second largest city.

In the afternoon, our guests brought a bit of Japan to the Grand Commons hosting a Japanese Fair. Many of our classes were able to visit giving students, and staff, a chance to dress in Kimonos and the uniforms that Hayato students wear to school everyday, explore Japanese Anime & Manga, and learn about different styles of Japanese food. Many students tried their hand at Origami and various traditional Japanese games like Kendama and Hanetsuki. Many staff and students left the fair with their name written in Japanese Calligraphy, a great keepsake to remember the experience.

The Japanese coordinator later shared how thrilled our guests were with how friendly and welcoming Handsworth staff and students were throughout their visit, way to go Royals!
