### Graduation Requirements

- ▶ BC Ministry of Education requires students to complete the following:
  - ▶ 52 credits "required" courses, includes CLC (coursework and Capstone)
  - 28 credits "elective" courses
  - ▶ 30 hours work/volunteer experience
  - NEW: minimum one course with an Indigenous focus (not an extra course)
  - Visit the <u>Ministry of Education</u> website for more specific information
- Capstone presentations: Friday, April 26

### Required Assessments

- ► Students must write
  - ▶ Numeracy 10
  - ▶ Literacy 10
  - ▶ Literacy 12
  - ▶ French Literacy 12 (French immersion students only)





### University Admission Requirements



Successful admission

- General requirements
  - Courses (gr 11, 12)
  - Second language\* and math
  - ► English language requirements
  - ► Holistic applications (UBC, Queens, others)
- Faculty or School requirements
  - Ex: Faculty of Arts, School of Nursing
- Program Requirements
  - ► Ex: International Relations
- GPA (specific courses)
- Personal Profile

### Case Study – UBC

- General admission requirements
  - Graduation from High School
  - ▶ Minimum of 70% in grade 11 or 12 English
  - ► At least six academic/non-academic grade 12 courses (recommended, but not required)
- Degree/Faculty Applied Science (Engineering)
  - ▶ Grade 12 courses: English (First Peoples) 12, Pre-Calc 12, Chem 12, Physics 12
  - ► Grade 11 courses: English (First Peoples) 11, Language 11 or waiver, Pre-Calc 11 or FOM 12, Chem 11, Physics 11

#### Holistic Admission

- Not just about the grades => supplemental application requirements vary between programs
  - Written submissions (ex: personal profile)
  - ▶ Letters of intent
  - Accomplishments
  - ▶ Personal preferences, interests, skill-sets
  - Portfolio

### English Language Requirement

- Most PSIs have an English language proficiency requirement
- English proficiency exams
  - Required for some students
    - ▶ If you have been living in Canada less than three years (UBC requires four)
    - ▶ If the past three years of schooling were at an institution where English is not the primary language of instruction
  - Example of exams
    - ► CAEL, Cambridge English Qualifications, IELTS, TOEFL

### Applying to BC Post-Secondary Institutions (PSIs)

timelines vary by school

- ▶ UVic
  - ▶ Jan 31 Most applications close
- ▶ <u>UBC</u>
  - Early October Applications open
  - ▶ Dec 1 Deadline to apply for first round offers of admission
  - ▶ Jan 15 Applications close
- ▶ CapU
  - ▶ Early October Applications open
  - March-May Applications close (varies among programs)
- ► SFU
  - ▶ Jan 31 Applications close
- Admission decisions early February-April...

## DVRs & Transcripts



### Diploma Verification Report (DVR)

- Lists the grade 10-12 courses that students have already completed, withdrawn from, and are registered in this year, as well as external credentials
- Includes interim marks, where available, and final marks
- Purpose
  - Verify information being sent to the Ministry of Education
  - Ensures graduation requirements are being met
  - Does not replace an official transcript
- Student's responsibility to make sure information on their DVR is correct
  - ▶ Part of Students' first CLC assignment

### Getting the record straight

- Students have already seen these in CLC
- Students correct errors (ex: online marks, external credits etc.)
  - online courses, reach out to online school
  - Handsworth courses or external credit, reach out to Ms. Renwick
- New data is reported to the Ministry regularly

### Transcripts

- Record of successfully-completed grade 10, 11, and 12 courses
- Register for a **BCeID**
- Order transcripts through Student Transcript Services (STS) - not done through Handsworth
- ▶ Information and instructions on the Handsworth website
- New information is pushed to the ministry frequently, starting in October



#### StudentTranscripts Service

#### Information For Students

StudentTranscripts Service (STS) is an online application for students to view their school marks, transcripts, scholarships and send transcripts electronically to post secondary institutions and employers.



#### Get Started

- Email address
- Go to the Ministry of Education's Transcripts and Certificate website at http://www.StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca.
- You must sign up for a BCeID before you can use the StudentTranscripts Service. For BCeID signup, you need to: Sign Up for a BCeID
  - Complete the fields to register for a basic BCeID
  - Select your password reset questions and answers (remember these as you will need them if you forget your password)
  - Follow the system prompts and sign up for StudentTranscripts Service.
- Log-in to StudentTranscripts Service using your BCelD. When registering for the Student Transcript Service using your BCeID, you will be prompted to:
  - Enter your student information used by your school (see Get Started information above)
  - Read the personal data collection info and complete the process by clicking "submit"
  - An email will be sent to the email address provided and must be activated within 24 hours of receipt or you will need to complete the registration process again
  - Once activated, you will be able to log onto STS using your BCeID and password.

Log in with BCeID

From your STS Dashboard, you can choose your post-secondary institutions (PSIs) selections, preview, send and order transcripts, view exam and assessment results and view scholarship information. Please note that all transcripts previewed in the STS are considered unofficial,

but official transcripts will be sent out when ordered.

You will need to consent to the STS privacy notice which enables the ministry to send your transcripts to your selected PSIs by paper or electronically depending on how the PSI is able to receive transcripts. Printed copies of transcripts may take up to 3 weeks for processing and delivery to your selected PSIs.

### How will PSIs get my transcripts and interim marks?



Give PSI permission to access your records when applying *or* send transcript electronically through STS



Most Canadian universities have XML, allows them to see student grades/transcripts automatically when Handsworth reports them to the Ministry of Education



Students who require transcripts with courses from grade 9 and above can contact our records clerk directly

### Reporting Grades

- Self-reporting
  - ▶ Most PSIs require students to self-report grade 11 and 12 grades
  - Semester 1 interim, semester 1 final, and/or semester 2 interim grades for Most BC PSIs
  - You do not need an official transcript to self-report
  - Online courses
    - ▶ June 30 typical deadline to finish online courses (check PSI)
    - ▶ Recommended to complete 50% of the course before self-reporting

### Ministry of Education Awards

#### BC Achievement Scholarships - \$1250 (no application required)

• Recognizes the 8,000 graduates with the top academic achievement in the province.

#### BC Excellence Scholarships - \$5000 (requires school nomination and application - deadline Feb 2024)

- 55 provincial total awards awarded to students who demonstrate service and leadership, both at school and in their communities, and show aptitude and commitment to their chosen career paths.
- Online applications will open in late Fall 2023 and will be due in February 2024 (days TBD).

#### Pathway to Teacher Education Scholarship - \$5000 (application required – deadline Feb. 2024)

- Awarded to 20 outstanding high school graduates who have demonstrated a commitment to and aptitude for a career in K-12 teaching.
- Must provide evidence of enrollment in qualifying education programs
- Online applications will open in late Fall 2023 and will be due in February 2024 (days TBD).

#### **District/Authority Scholarships**

- Handsworth is allotted approx. 35-40 awards for high school graduates who have demonstrated excellence in primarily non-academic subjects (ex: fine arts, ADST)
- Recipients determined by subject teachers

### Numerous other scholarships....

Various large-scale awards:

(Ex: Loran, TD, Queen's Chancellor)

Community-based (Ex: North Vancouver High School Education Foundation)
