Outdoor School Program Informed Consent and Acknowledgement of Risk

To be completed for participants under the age of 19.

Purpose of the Program

The Outdoor School program or ODS is a residential outdoor environmental experience designed to enhance students' understanding of, and respect for, the environment. Additionally, through the supervised residential living experience, students take on new responsibilities and challenges, and have opportunities to develop confidence, resilience and a sense of independence. A detailed Parent Handbook outlining the ODS program has been provided by your child's school or teacher for your reference. Parents/guardians are advised to read through the Handbook with their child to become familiar with the program format.

Nature and Scope of Risks

ODS's residential learning environment involves inherent risks that may be different or greater than those found in a normal school setting. The program has been designed to provide appropriate experiences and challenges given the age of the participants and program staff strive to minimize risk of injury or harm to participants.

ODS activities involving risk include, but are not limited to: travel, caving, low ropes course, archery, canoeing, hiking, campfires, aquatic and farm-based field studies. Risks associated with these activities include but are not limited to: exposure to inclement weather, slipping, falling from a height, insect or animal bites, being struck by falling objects, immersion in cold water, uneven terrain, walking alongside and in streams, social or economic losses due to actions of others, loss or damage of personal property, injury, illness, or death. Accidents can be the result of the nature of the activity and can occur without any fault on the part of the student, the School Board or its employees or contracted agents.

Safety Precautions

Parents/guardians are required to complete a comprehensive medical/dietary form for their child to ensure Ist Aid Staff can respond to medical needs in an appropriate and timely manner. Medications are kept in the First Aid Clinic and distributed by the Clinic staff. Note that 1st Aid Staff are not registered practitioners and do not possess specialized training for diabetes, epilepsy or other serious conditions. In an emergency, Squamish General Hospital is 15 minutes from the Cheakamus Centre site.

Supervision

Students are supervised throughout the Outdoor School program. 24 hour supervision is provided by Cheakamus Centre program staff, visiting teachers and support staff, and volunteer counsellors. Trained high school counsellors are assigned to each cabin group and are responsible for guiding students to meals, chores, field studies and recreation activities. Classroom teachers are available for direct supervision of students throughout the day, on field studies and during assigned evening teacher time.

Behavioural Expectations

Each visiting schools' Code of Conduct applies to students during the ODS program. In addition, students are expected to abide by the following ODS guidelines:

-stay in bounds

- treat animals and plants with care

-follow instructions from staff and counsellors - report illness or accidents immediately to staff

-remain quiet at night and in their cabin

- treat other students and staff with respect
