Monday Message

Dear Ross Road Families,

Welcome back to school! We hope everyone got a chance to rest and recharge and connect with loved ones during the break. The return to school will look a little bit different... once again.

Please take time to read the <u>March 24<sup>th</sup> letter</u> from our acting Superintendent, Sylvia Russell. This message contains important information and links that will answer many of your questions regarding the changes to our daily routines at schools in North Vancouver. The <u>school</u> <u>district website</u> has been updated and includes links to the <u>Federal</u> <u>guidelines</u> regarding mask wearing for 14 days for those that travelled outside Canada. Please keep in mind that some changes will be instantly visible, while others will take some time. We appreciate your patience, once again, as we shift our practices and procedures accordingly.

Here at Ross Road, for the first few weeks back we will continue to follow many of the routines that have been helpful in keeping Ross Road a safe and orderly place to learn.

- We encourage everyone to continue with a <u>daily health check</u> and to stay at home when sick
- Continue to practice healthy hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette (careful coughing and sneezing)
- Masks are now optional, and we will respect everyone's choice to activate this layer of protection whenever needed (unless you have travelled outside the country then please follow <u>Federal Guidelines</u>)

- As has always been the practice at Ross Road, students are asked to line up outside before school to be greeted by their teacher and will also continue to be dismissed from the same doors
- Parents, guardians, and siblings are still asked to wait outside. We have noticed a tremendous increase in student independence, particularly with our youngest students, when hallways are clear, and students can focus on their responsibilities upon arrival and preparation for departure.
- Parents and guardians are still asked to make appointments (email or phone call) to meet with school staff before or after school.

We are hopeful and excited for the changes, but this will take some time and we will carry out any adjustments with the needs of learners and space constraints at the forefront.
