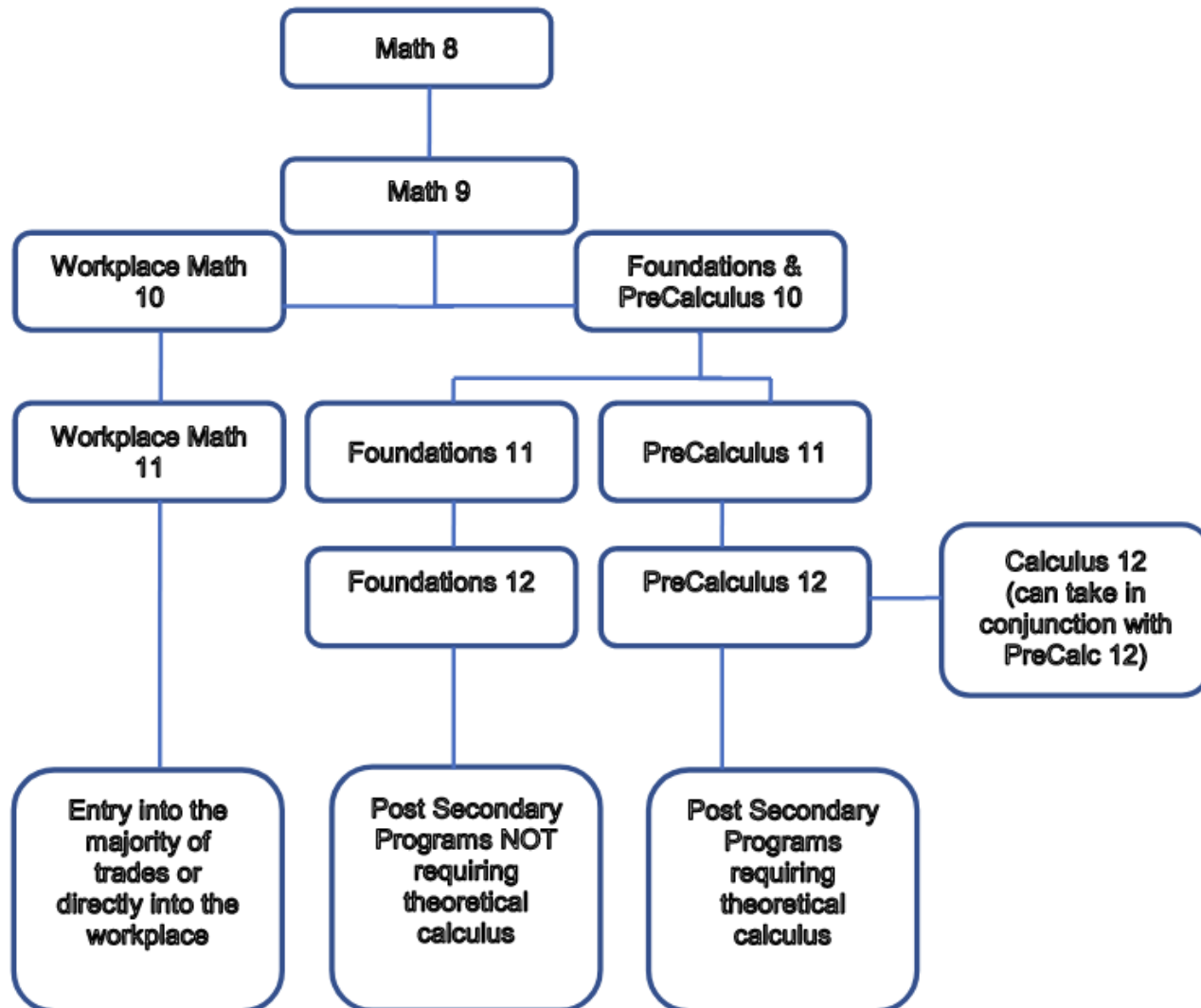

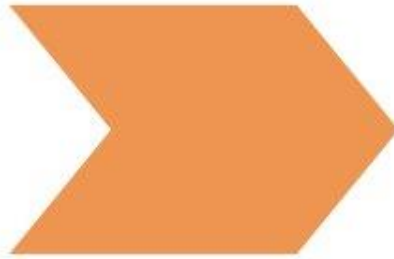
How does WEX Work?

1. Prepare



In the first month, students work through assignments that help determine their career focus

2. Present



Meet with the teacher and facilitator to determine what kind of placement would be a good fit

3. Placement



Students work 90 hours at their placement. These can be divided into two placements.

4. Post-Placement



Self reflect and evaluate experience, update resume. Consider education options for continuing

Placement in an academy program is based on availability, in the event interest in an academy is greater than available positions, the following priorities will be offered conditional acceptance:

- **Priority 2:** Wait-listed students from previous year
- **Priority 3:** Lottery of remaining students per Board Policy 605: Admission of Students to Schools.

Course Programming

Course Programming

Selecting a program of studies is an important process that should involve students, parents, teachers, administrators and counsellors. After careful consideration, courses should be chosen based on the student's strengths, interests and future requirements. Students are asked to list alternative choices on their course selection sheets, as their preferred choices may not schedule due to timetable constraints.
