

BC Ministry of Education Graduation Requirements

Students must earn a minimum of 80 credits: required credits (48), elective credits (28), and Career Life Education 12 (4). Listed below are the requirements for graduation. Note: Students going on to post-secondary need to fulfill BC Ministry of Education Graduation Requirements in addition to the “entrance” requirements for their specific post-secondary program.

Physical & Health Education 10	4 credits
An Arts Education or Applied Skills, Design or Technologies 10, 11 or 12	4 credits
Career Life Education 10	4 credits
Career Life Connections 12	4 credits
Mandatory Provincial Numeracy Assessment 10 (Not blended with a course mark)	Assessment score will be shown on students' Transcripts
Mandatory Provincial Literacy Assessment 10 (Not blended with a course mark)	Assessment score will be shown on students' Transcripts
Mandatory Provincial Literacy Assessment 12 (Not blended with a course mark) *This assessment will not be implemented for Grade 12s until the 2021-2022 school year	Assessment score will be shown on students' Transcripts
ELECTIVE CREDITS (28) (grades 10-12)	
Students must earn at least 28 credits for grade 10-12	28 credits
OVERALL TOTAL (80)	
Of the 80 credits for graduation, at least 16 credits must be at the grade 12 level, including English 12.	80 credits

BEYOND 80 CREDITS: Eighty credits represents the minimum necessary for graduation. We encourage students to take full advantage of the opportunity to take a variety of courses to complete up to 96 credits (a full course load for grades 10– 12).
