





# AP PSYCHOLOGY



#### Advanced Placement (AP) Psychology

- AP courses are first year university-level courses for high school students
- helps prepare students for university level courses while still in high school
- can take the AP exam in May to potentially score 4 or 5 to receive first year course credit for university (consult with instituion of choice)
- nearly all Canadian & U.S. universities accept AP courses as do many international schools for entrance
- AP courses on transcripts can help a student stand out
- should be an academic student to keep up with the rigorous pace
- must be prepared to do homework on a regular basis and attend additional classes during tutorial time and outside the timetable



#### **BIG IDEAS**

Complex roles and relationships contribute to diversity of ecosystems.

Changing ecosystems are maintained by natural processes. Human practices affect the sustainability of ecosystems.

Humans can play a role in **stewardship** and restoration of ecosystems.




# What will this course look like?



- This course aims to establish a more meaningful connection to our local environment!
- Within this course, students will be exploring real-life issues that the environment faces today, and considering how we can contribute to solutions
- Example topics include:
  - redesigning the packaging of popular products to be more sustainable and eco-friendly
  - benefiting local bat populations by building and deploying bat houses
  - monitoring the population of local sea stars as they recover from sea star wasting syndrome
  - considering different local methods of wildlife management, such as the local extinction of coyotes from Stanley Park, and offering alternatives
  - working with local organizations such as Ocean Wise, Stanley Park Ecology Society,
     MetroVancouver Youth 4Action, and more!






