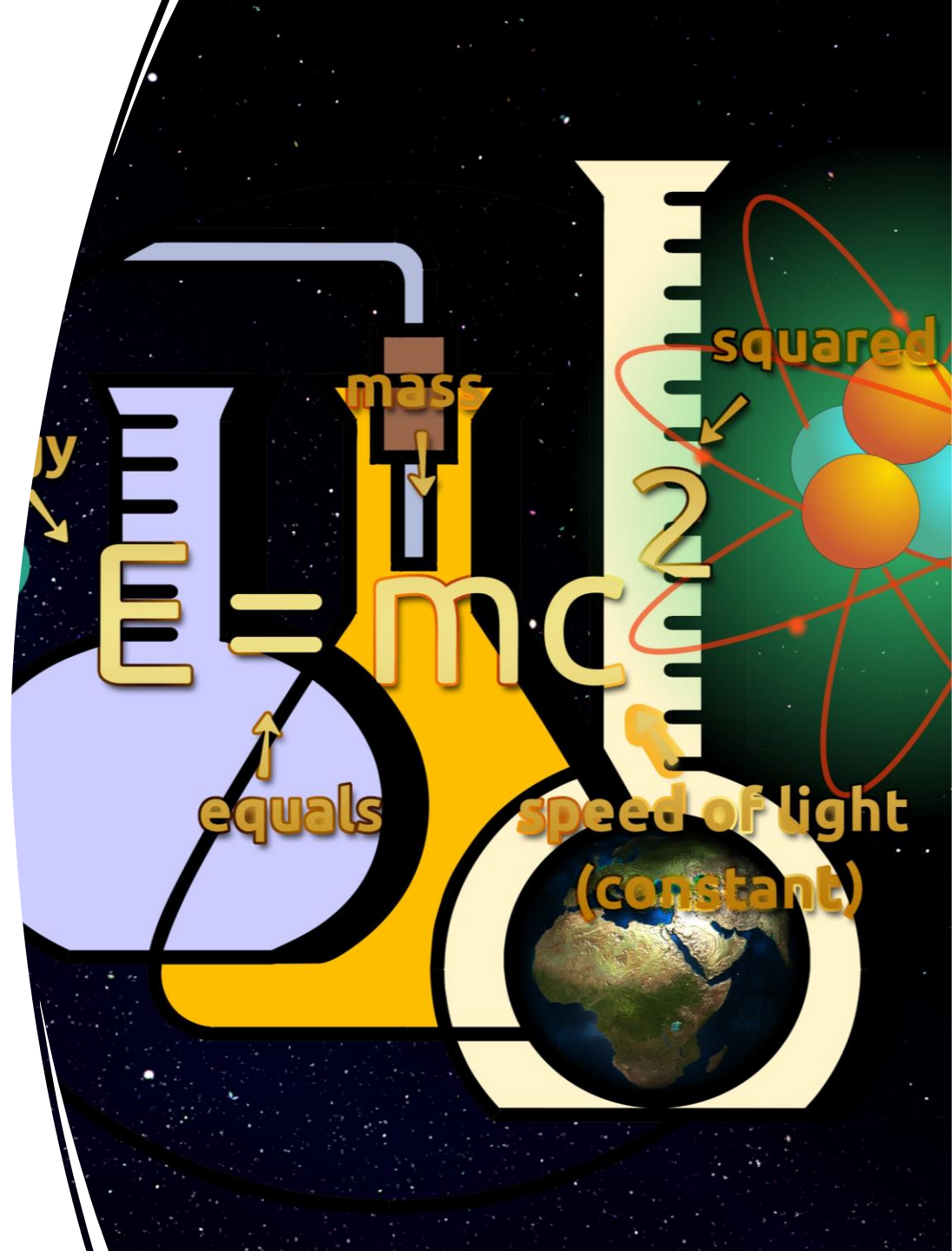

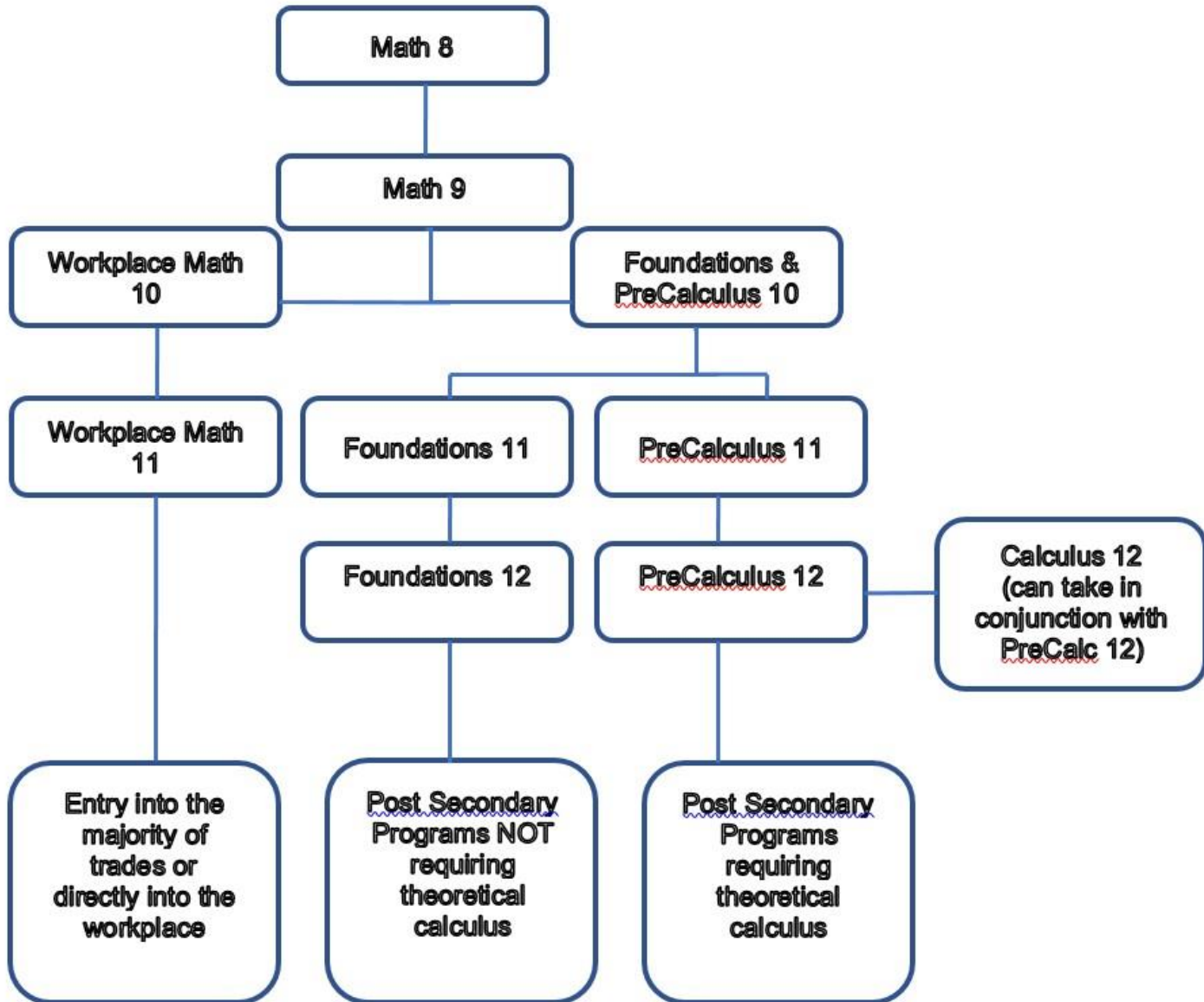

How does WEX Work?

1. Prepare



In the first month, students work through assignments that help determine their career focus

2. Present



Meet with the teacher and facilitator to determine what kind of placement would be a good fit

3. Placement



Students work 90 hours at their placement. These can be divided into two placements.

4. Post-Placement



Self reflect and evaluate experience, update resume. Consider education options for continuing

Placement in an academy program is based on availability, in the event interest in an academy is greater than available positions, the following priorities will be offered conditional acceptance:

- **Priority 3:** Lottery of remaining students per Board Policy 605: Admission of Students to Schools.
