What is It?

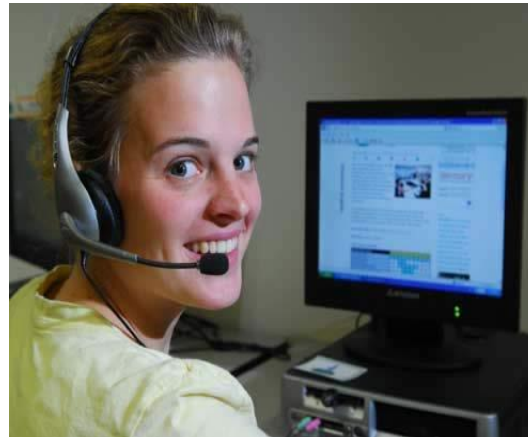


- alternate way to complete core academic courses and electives in grade 8-12
- course materials and resources are housed online
- teacher/student interaction: online, face-to-face, via email, phone and virtual classroom
- continuous entry/self-paced or cohort/synchronous
- learning with a technology focus: using digital tools

- flexible: self-paced, anytime, anywhere learning
- frees up student timetable to enroll in additional classes
- supports elite athlete's training schedules, part-time work schedules

“Blended” DL Centre Model




Main DL Centre: Mountainside Secondary

- meet with DL teachers
 - receive face-to-face academic/tutorial support
 - work on their courses
 - test invigilation
 - tech support

- ✓ Main DL Centre opened daily, flexible hours, between 8 am to 8pm
 - ✓ test invigilation, tutorial support, tech support

- ✓ Satellite DL Centres: (at each Secondary School): open based on-site DL staff schedules

- ✓ Virtual Classroom: open Wednesday and Thursday nights from 6pm - 8pm: students and parents are welcome to attend!

Parent Role



- encourage your student to set timelines
 - monitor timelines
 - Set expectations and provide encouragement
 - Use "Mentor Manager" in Moodle to check gradebook and progress
 - encourage attendance at the DL Centre
 - connect with the DL teacher through Moodle messaging, email, and phone

Registration



Step 1:

- Meet with your grade counsellor to determine if DL is the right fit for you!
- Create your graduation plan

Step 2:

- Complete registration forms, available on the DL website
- Submit forms to your grade counsellor for signature
- Make sure forms are submitted to NVDLS

Step 3:

- Receive your login and password (students and parents)
- Login immediately and get started: message your DL teacher, update your profile and bio and set completion timelines
