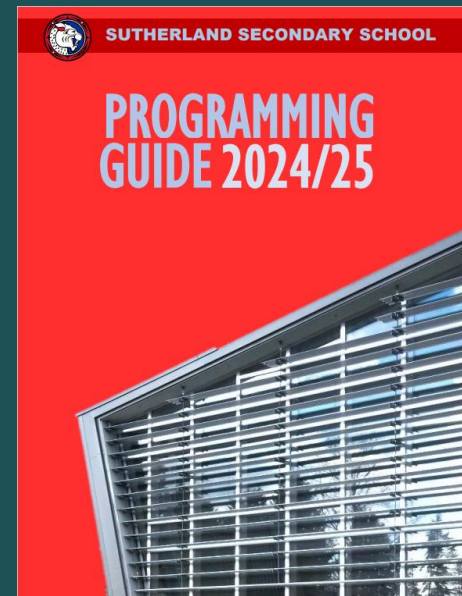

Planning for Graduation and Beyond...

“exit plan does not mean entrance plan”

Highschool Graduation

- 80 credits (minimum) Grade 10-12
 - 3 Government Assessments
- Second language is not required to graduate
- Any Math 11 will fulfil graduation requirements

Post-Secondary Entrance

- Highschool graduation with institution specific requirements
- Second language 11 required to enter UBC and SFU
- Most universities require the Foundation or Pre-Calculus Math pathway to at least Grade 11
- Some post-secondary programs accept Workplace Math 11

Grade 10 Program

The Grade Ten program consists of eight (8) courses including:

- English 10
- Social 10 or Social Explorer
- A Math 10
- Science 10
- Physical Education 10 or Academy
- Career Life Education 10
- Elective (a language)*

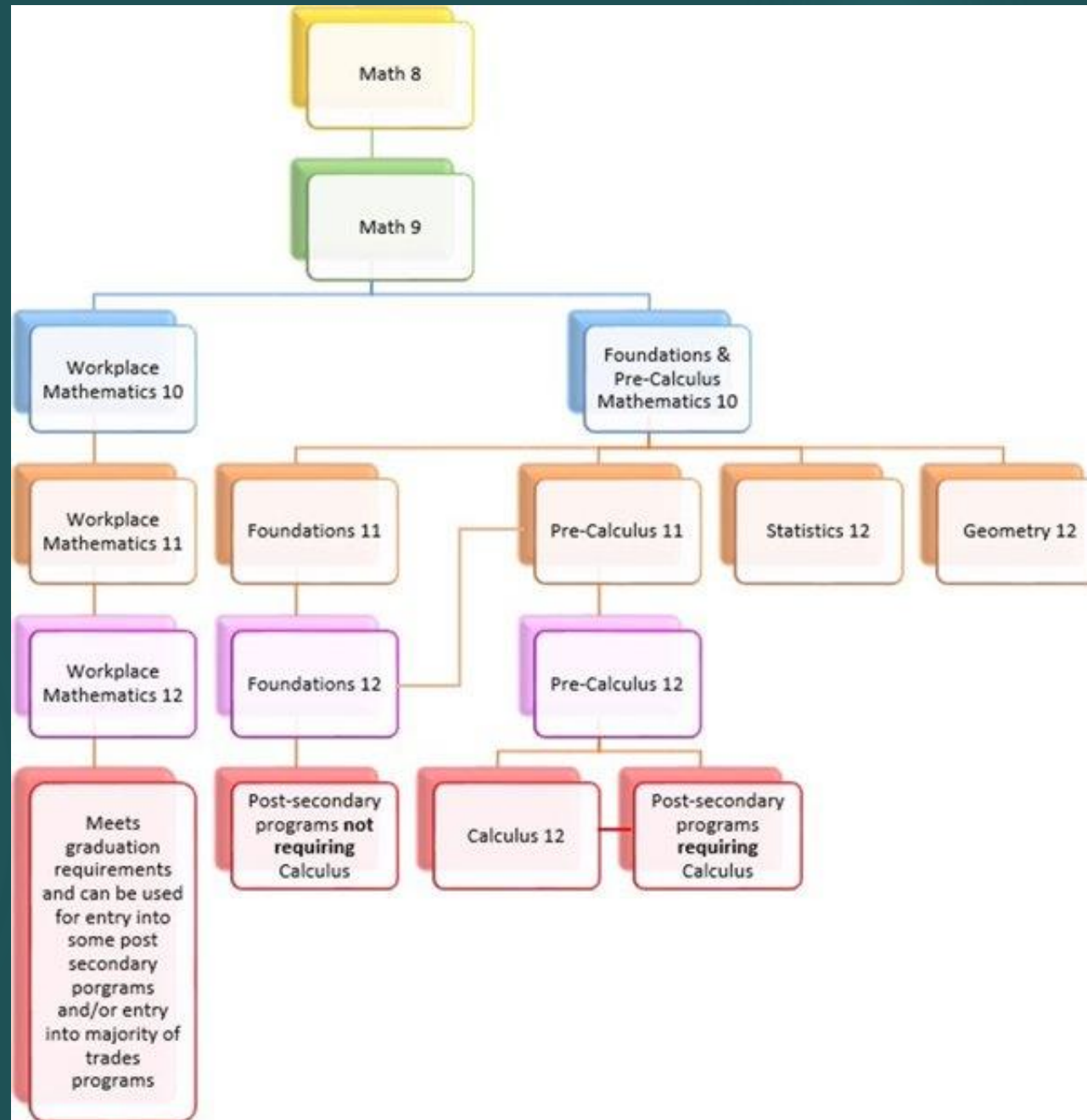

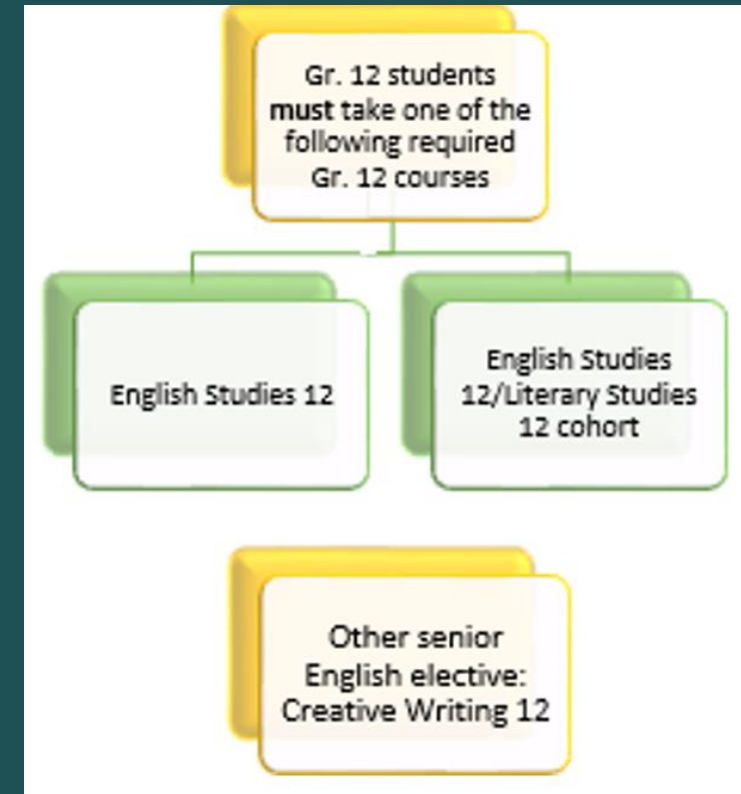
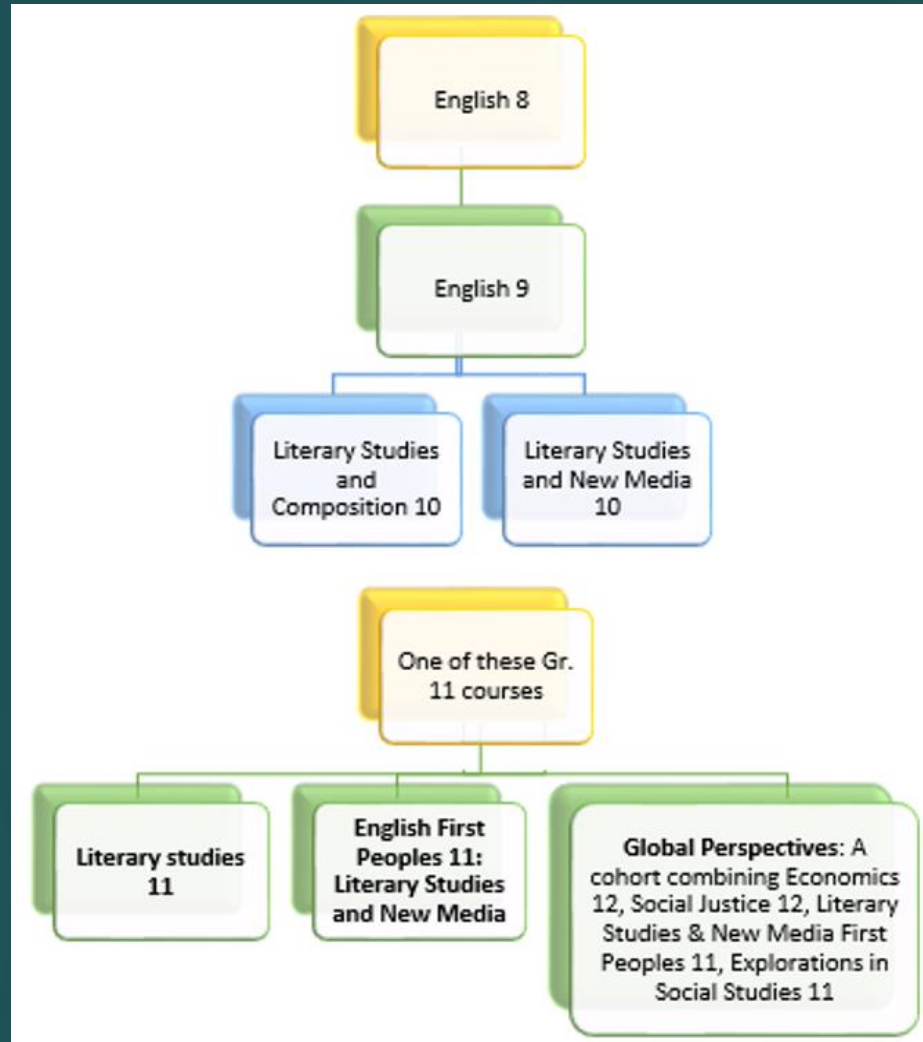

Ways to support your student...
“Guide on the Side”



- Review the course guide and course information
- Know your classes and timetable
- Establish routines – homework vs. home study.
- Manage time – sleep, waking up, homework, screen time, sports, etc.
- Coach students to problem solve, advocate for themselves and manage stresses
- Use tutorial time (8:30 – 9:12) to work with their teachers.
- As a parent, show interest in what your child is learning and doing.
