GRAD BANQUET 2023- Ticket Procedure

Tickets for this year's graduation banquet will go on sale soon!

Here are the relevant details you need to know when purchasing your tickets:

- Date of event: Saturday June 24th, 2023
- Time of event: Grad photo at 5:30pm, doors open at 6:00pm, dinner at 6:30pm
- Location of event: Vancouver Convention Centre West

How to buy tickets:

- Tickets will be available for sale from April 11th May 5th
- Payments can be made through the school cash online website: https://sd44.schoolcashonline.com/
- Tickets are \$150 each. One ticket is required per person (including graduates)
- · We are aware that this is a more expensive event for our families than we have held in the past, but with the rising cost of food and services brought on by the pandemic it is the lowest price we can charge in attempt to break even on this event
- There is no limit to the number of tickets that can be purchased by each graduate and their families/guests.

What do to once tickets are purchased:

- · Decide who you would like to sit with at the event
- Pick up one table captain sheet from the "Grad Info" board in the cafeteria or print one from the MS Teams Grad Info page and fill it in with the full names of each person sitting at the table
- Tables will seat up to 10 people comfortably and grade 12 students must sit with their families and guests
- Bring your table captain form to room 511 on May 10th at lunch to pick a table and pick up your tickets for the event.
- · All attendees must present their ticket at the door upon arrival to the banquet
- · Any tables with fewer than 8 people may be filled with graduates and their families as needed.

GRADE 12 CAPSTONE INFORMATION

To our Windsor Parents:

Some of you may or may not have heard that in Grade 12 the students must do a Capstone project and then a presentation.

The Capstone is a rigorous learning opportunity that allows students to reflect and share in personally meaningful ways and is a requirement for Career-Life Connections and for graduation.

The purpose of the Capstone is to let students demonstrate the knowledge, competencies, and passion(s) that they can offer the world, as they integrate personal interests, strengths, and new learning with preferred future possibilities. It is a deeper learning experience that supports the student's continued learning journey into post-graduation possibilities and provides an opportunity to reflect and synthesise as well as showcase and celebrate.

It is a place where students are encouraged to share successes both in school and out of school. They will share their reflections on Core Competency development, their contributions and aspirations, and their plans for post-graduation. The Capstone can take many different forms, depending on student needs and interests and the opportunities available in local school communities.

We have over 170 grads this year, and 170 different Capstones. From creating art pieces, to community work, to writing stories and creating documentaries, to making items and donating them to animal shelters, or to the homeless.

We wanted to share out what form some of the Capstones take on.

GRADE 12 CAPSTONE INFORMATION (cont.)

Present Year:

Jade's Capstone project is to fundraise and donate the money to Doctors Without Borders. She started in October and was donating her own money from paid work and selling items (\$2000). Then she went farther out to friends and family. With the earthquake overseas, she has expanded her fundraising efforts and is now reaching out to our Windsor Community.




Artwork in and around the school came from inspirations from students and then created by our past grads

WHEN REPORTING ABSENCES

- First Name
- <u>Last Name</u> (if leaving a voice message please spell the last name)
- Grade
- <u>Date of absence</u> (whole day/portion of the day)
- <u>Explanation for absence</u> ("excused", "ill", "appointment", "vacation"). It is critical that student absence explanations are specific to ensure accurate reporting to the School District and Public Health Unit.
- Your name & relationship with the student. (Only messages from parents and legal guardians are accepted


When changing your mailing address, please attach a copy of proof of address. An example would be a utility bill, BCID, Drivers Licence, credit card invoice etc.
