

Article 13 of the UN Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples states:

Indigenous peoples have the right to revitalize, use, develop and transmit to future generations their histories, languages, oral traditions, philosophies, writing systems and literatures, and to designate and retain their own names for communities, places and persons. <u>reference</u>

Reconciliation In Learning Services Dinner and Dialogue
