## The Jingle Dance

Have you seen recent videos of Jingle Dancers, sharing dances to spread healing and kindness?Do you know the history of the Jingle Dance?

"The story is about a young girl, who seems to be very sick ... her father is worried that she's going to die," said Child. "He has a vision of a new dress, a very special dress.... The way they tell the story in central Minnesota is that the little girl was at a drum ceremony with her family, and after she started dancing with the other women doing these ... special dance steps, she started to feel better." reference

The Jingle Dance is from the Ojibwe Nations and started during the time of the Spanish Flu pandemic of 1919. Brenda Child, Red Lake Ojibwe explains about the history of the Jingle Dance. 




