year anniversary of the Vancouver 2010 Olympics in which the Four Host Nations welcomed the world to the territory and the Vancouver 2010 Olympics. The Four Host Nations are the Lil'Wat, Tsleil-Waututh, Musqueam and Skwxwú7mesh. The Youth Gathering had over three hundred youth participants representing First Nations, Métis and Inuit. Cheakamus Centre was the home base for the youth who participated in the the Youth Gathering.






Are you looking for ways to implement Indigenous Literature in your curriculum?


